

Major Predictions By Christ of His Death

The Passion Foretold – 1st Occurrence

Matthew 16:20-28	Mark 8:30-9:1	Luke 9:21-27
<p>Jesus Predicts His Death</p> <p>21From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, <u>and that he must be killed</u> and on the third day be raised to life.</p> <p>22Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"</p> <p>23Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men."</p> <p>24Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. 25For whoever wants to save his life[h] will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will find it. 26What good will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul? Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul? 27For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what he has done. 28I tell you the truth, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom."</p>	<p>Jesus Predicts His Death</p> <p>31He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, <u>and that he must be killed</u> and after three days rise again. 32He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.</p> <p>33But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men."</p> <p>34Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. 35For whoever wants to save his life[c] will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me and for the gospel will save it. 36What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul? 37Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul? 38If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."</p> <p>Mark 9:1And he said to them, "I tell you the truth, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."</p>	<p>21Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone. 22And he said, "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, <u>and he must be killed</u> and on the third day be raised to life."</p> <p>23Then he said to them all: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. 24For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will save it. 25What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit his very self? 26If anyone is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his glory and in the glory of the Father and of the holy angels. 27I tell you the truth, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God."</p>

The Passion Again Foretold – 2nd Occurrence

Matthew 17:22, 23	Mark 9:30-32	Luke 9:43-45
<p>22When they came together in Galilee, he said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into the hands of men. <u>23They will kill him</u>, and on the third day he will be raised to life." And the disciples were filled with grief.</p>	<p>30They left that place and passed through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know where they were, 31because he was teaching his disciples. He said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into the hands of men. <u>They will kill him</u>, and after three days he will rise." 32But they did not understand what he meant and were afraid to ask him about it.</p>	<p>43And they were all amazed at the greatness of God.</p> <p>While everyone was marveling at all that Jesus did, he said to his disciples, 44"Listen carefully to what I am about to tell you: The Son of Man is <u>going to be betrayed</u> into the hands of men." 45But they did not understand what this meant. It was hidden from them, so that they did not grasp it, and they were afraid to ask him about it.</p>

Death of Christ foretold - 3rd Occurrence

Matthew 20:17-19	Mark 10:32-34	Luke 18:31-34
<p>Jesus Again Predicts His Death</p> <p>17Now as Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside and said to them, 18"We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death 19and will turn him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged <u>and crucified</u>. On the third day he will be raised to life!"</p>	<p>Jesus Again Predicts His Death</p> <p>32They were on their way up to Jerusalem, with Jesus leading the way, and the disciples were astonished, while those who followed were afraid. Again he took the Twelve aside and told them what was going to happen to him. 33"We are going up to Jerusalem," he said, "and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles, 34who will mock him and spit on him, flog him <u>and kill him</u>. Three days later he will rise."</p>	<p>Jesus Again Predicts His Death</p> <p>31Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled. 32He will be handed over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, insult him, spit on him, flog him <u>and kill him</u>. 33On the third day he will rise again."</p> <p>34The disciples did not understand any of this. Its meaning was hidden from them, and they did not know what he was talking about.</p>

Robertson's Word Pictures of the New Testament

Matthew 20:17

Apart (κατ' ἑαυτοῦ).

This is the prediction in Matthew of the cross (16:21; 17:22; 20:17). "Aside by themselves" (Moffatt). The verb is παρελαβεν. Jesus is having his inward struggle (Mark 10:32) and makes one more effort to get the Twelve to understand him

In these three occurrences of Jesus' prediction of his death and resurrection, this is the only time any of the Gospel writers uses the word *cross* or *crucifixion*. All other accounts is translated "killed."

First Occurrence

Matthew 16:21

Mark 8:31

Second Occurrence

Mark 9:31

παραδίδομι – Betrayed

Third Occurrence

Matthew 20:19

19 καὶ παραδώσουσιν αὐτὸν τοῖς ἔθνεσιν εἰς τὸ ἐμπαῖξαι καὶ μαστιγῶσαι καὶ σταυρῶσαι, καὶ τῇ τρίτῃ ἡμέρᾳ ἐγερθήσεται.

Σταυροο (Stauroo) – to Crucify; Strong's 4717

Mark 10:34

34 καὶ ἐμπαίξουσιν αὐτῷ καὶ ἐμπτύσουσιν αὐτῷ καὶ μαστιγώσουσιν αὐτὸν καὶ ἀποκτενοῦσιν, καὶ μετὰ τρεῖς ἡμέρας ἀναστήσεται.

Αποκτεινο (Apokteino) – to kill in any manner whatsoever; Strong's Number 615

Luke 18:33
